Free Talks and Guided Walks

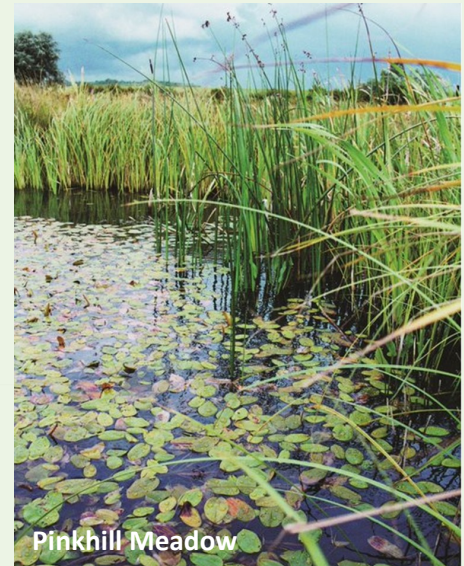
